EMPLOY FLORIDA REGISTRATION



Employ Florida is Florida's state job board where you can search and apply for jobs. Registration is required to receive CareerSource Escarosa services.

To register or sign in, go to <https://www.employflorida.com>

- At the top right side of the home page, click SIGN IN / REGISTER
- Choose Individual Registration to create a new user account or Sign In if you already have an account.
- Scroll down to read the entire Privacy Agreement, check the blue box indicating you read and understand, then click I Agree to continue.
- Fill in all required (*) fields on all pages. Click Next to proceed to the next page.

Note: Be sure to write down your username and password — you will need them each time you log in to your Employ Florida account.

- Click the Finish button on the last page. When the “What would you like to do next?” page displays, your account is created, and you are signed in. Options on this page will vary depending on your site configuration.



REEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE

Top 10 things to know about Reemployment Assistance (RA) in Florida:

RA, more commonly known as “unemployment”, provides temporary financial help for qualified individuals who lost a job through no fault of their own. It is not an automatic right.

To ensure accurate and quick payments:

1. Report Accurate Unemployment Reason:

Clearly state why you left your job to avoid fraud and receive proper assistance.

2. Report All Wages Earned:

Report gross wages for every week you work, even if not yet paid, to avoid fraud and prosecution.

3. Register with Employ Florida:

Use EF (www.EmployFlorida.com) for job referrals, resume building, and re-employment services.

4. Be Available for Work:

You must be able, available, and willing to accept suitable work. Report any limitations (e.g., school, childcare, transportation).

5. Actively Search for Work:

Search for work every week you claim benefits, or your benefits may be denied.

6. Develop an Effective Work Search Plan:

EF can help you plan your job search and find training.

7. Avoid Errors:

Read all provided information carefully to prevent overpayments and delays/denials of future benefits.

8. Report Return to Work Immediately:

Whether part-time or full-time, notify RA as soon as you start working and reduce or stop claiming benefits. To avoid serious consequences, don't wait for your first paycheck to notify your state's RA office.

9. Follow Rules to Prevent Fraud:

Understand and follow all state laws. Failure can lead to prosecution, penalties, loss of future benefits, and even jail time.

10. Know Your Responsibilities and Ask for Help:

You are legally responsible for understanding RA rules. If confused, contact your state RA office for assistance.

HEALTH INSURANCE RESOURCES

COBRA offers temporary health coverage after certain life events like job loss, divorce, or a child losing dependent status. Employers can charge the full cost plus a 2% fee, which is often more expensive than active employee rates. COBRA applies to most private-sector employers

(20+ employees) and state/local governments, but not federal or church plans. Many states have "mini-COBRA" for smaller employers. COBRA covers medical care but not life insurance or disability benefits. Contact your employer's human resources department for more information.

Alternative Coverage Options

Before electing COBRA, consider other options, which may be more affordable:

Other Group Plans: HIPAA allows you to enroll in another group plan (like a spouse's) within 30 days of losing job-based coverage, provided you had other coverage when you initially declined.

Health Insurance Marketplace: Losing job-based coverage qualifies you for a special enrollment period here. You can compare plans and may qualify for tax credits to lower premiums and other cost-sharing premium reductions. COBRA eligibility doesn't affect Marketplace eligibility or tax credits. You have 60 days before or after losing coverage to enroll. If you need immediate coverage, COBRA can bridge the gap until your Marketplace plan starts. Apply at <https://HealthCare.gov> or call 1-800-318-2596.

Medicaid/CHIP: The Marketplace can also help you determine if you qualify for free or low-cost coverage through Medicaid or the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). You can apply anytime, and coverage typically begins immediately.

Florida Blue and Community Health: CareerSource Escambia can refer you to these programs through Crosswalk. Ask your career advisor about this as an option for you.

Future Enrollment Opportunities

If you elect COBRA, you can still enroll in another plan later if you have a new qualifying event (e.g., marriage, birth, or exhausting your COBRA coverage). However, ending COBRA early without a new special enrollment opportunity generally means waiting until the next open enrollment period for other coverage.

Resume & Application

Target Audience: Job seekers who need assistance developing a resume and completing an employment application.

Interviewing Like a S.T.A.R.

When browsing job listings on Employ Florida, you might notice some postings labeled as "Preferred Employer." These employers collaborate directly with CareerSource Escarosa staff to advertise their positions. If a job listing does not have the "Preferred Employer" label, it is considered an "External" posting, imported from another job board. For these external jobs, we advise job seekers to visit the employer's career page to ensure the positions are still open and available before applying.

WIOA Dislocated Worker training grants provide financial assistance to individuals who have lost their jobs through no fault of their own, such as due to company closures or mass layoffs. These grants help eligible workers gain new skills and certifications in in-demand occupations to re-enter the workforce quickly. Eligible training typically includes occupational skills training, on-the-job training, and adult education programs that lead to sustainable employment.

Local Program


Local Workforce Development Boards (LWDBs) like CareerSource Escarosa provide Rapid Response services when employers submit layoff and business closing notices under the Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification (WARN) Act or when there is an announcement or notification of a permanent closure (regardless of the number of affected employees), a mass layoff (affecting 50 or more workers), a mass job dislocation resulting from a natural or other disaster, or when a Trade Adjustment Assistance petition has been filed.

State Program

Florida Commerce's State Rapid Response Program serves as Florida's Dislocated Worker Coordination Unit, as required by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act.

Florida Commerce Mobile Unit

In support of Rapid Response activities, FloridaCommerce has a Mobile Career Center that can be deployed across the state to respond to layoffs and participate in job fairs upon request by CareerSource Escarosa. The Mobile Career Center offers a full array of employment, reemployment and employer services. Internet access is available for filing reemployment assistance claims, searching Employ Florida, and other job boards.





ABOUT TRADE ADJUSTMENT ASSISTANCE

Program Overview

The Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA) program is a federal initiative designed to help U.S. workers who've lost their jobs, or are at risk of losing them, due to foreign trade. It equips these workers with the skills and support needed for reemployment.

To qualify for TAA, a group of impacted workers (or their representative) must petition the U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL). The USDOL then investigates to confirm that increased foreign trade caused job losses or reductions in hours/wages.

Services Provided

Once the USDOL certifies a petition, eligible workers can access a range of TAA benefits, including:

- **Training:** To acquire new skills.
- **Trade Readjustment Allowances (TRA):** Weekly payments while seeking work and approved training.
- **Job Search and Relocation Allowances:** Financial assistance for finding and moving to new employment.
- **Health Coverage Tax Credits (HCTC):** Help with healthcare costs.
- **Reemployment Trade Adjustment Assistance (RTAA):** Wage supplements for workers aged 50 and older.

Eligible workers can also access general career services like counseling, testing, and job referrals. Workers who are still employed but notified of future layoffs can even receive pre-separation training.

Note: As of June 30, 2022, the TAA program no longer accepts new petitions. However, individuals covered under previously approved petitions remain eligible for services.
